



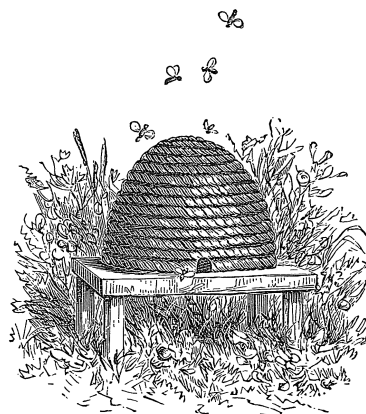

On September 11, 2010 Rod Stahl was the proud recipient of Washoe County Citizens Corps Volunteer of the Year award. Washoe County has several Volunteer groups; this year FEMA has awarded this group the National Achievement Award for Most Outstanding Citizen Corps Council 2010. The Citizen Corps Programs, including SMART, CHSC, CERT, ART, and our Law Enforcement Chaplains, were recognized in Washington, DC on September 23 as a part of the National Preparedness Month Festivities.

Sheriff Michael Haley also added, "From protecting children, responding to emergencies and supporting professional responders in training and exercises to enhancing homeland security efforts, your teams have answered the call for your past, present and future efforts on behalf of the Washoe County Sheriff's Office." Reed R. Moseley

Reed is proud to claim the status of being a native Nevadan. He was born in Winnemucca, Nevada in June 1947, son of George and Jean Moseley. His early years were spent on his grandfather's 4R Ranch in Paradise Valley, starting school in Winnemucca and moving to Lovelock in the fourth grade. He graduated from high school in Lovelock in 1965.

He married Linda Witzemann in Lovelock on March 4, 1967. They have two children, Jason and Brandie, 3 grandsons, 4 granddaughters, 2 great grandsons and 1 great granddaughter. After completing one and a half years of college at the University of Nevada-Reno, he went to work for the Humboldt River Water District. In 1969, he went to work for the Department Of Motor Vehicles, Motor Carrier Division as a field agent and was stationed in Elko. In 1980, Reed was promoted to the rank of Sergeant. The Motor Carrier division was combined with the Nevada Highway Patrol in 1988 and he retired from the Highway patrol in July 1994, having served his entire career in Elko.

Reed started his Masonic affiliation when he was in high school, serving as Master Councilor of the DeMolay Chapter in Lovelock and as State Scribe-Treasurer in 1967. He joined the Elko Masonic Lodge in 1975, and served as it's Master in 1982. His affiliation with the York Rite began in 1978, where he served as High Priest-1983, Illustrious Master-1985 and Commander-1984. He served as DeMolay Advisor and Rainbow Pop for several years. He is currently Trustee of Elko Lodge #15 and Secretary/Recorder of the Elko York Rite Bodies. Reed, along with his wife and daughter joined Elko Chapter of Easter Star in 1997 and has server as Worth Patron twice.

Reed became active in the Grand York Rite Bodies, and served as MIGM-1995-96, GHP-1997-98 and EGC-1998-99. He is past Governor of York Rite College #144 and Past Prior of Nevada Priory #50 KYCH. He is a member of Kilkenny Council No.33, Knight Masons, St. Matthias Tabernacle #57 HRAKTP and Joan of Arc Conclave Red Cross of Constantine. He is a member of Kerak Shrine and past president of the Elko Shrine Club. Reed is a 33rd degree Scottish Rite Mason and has served as president of the Elko Scottish Rite Club for many years.

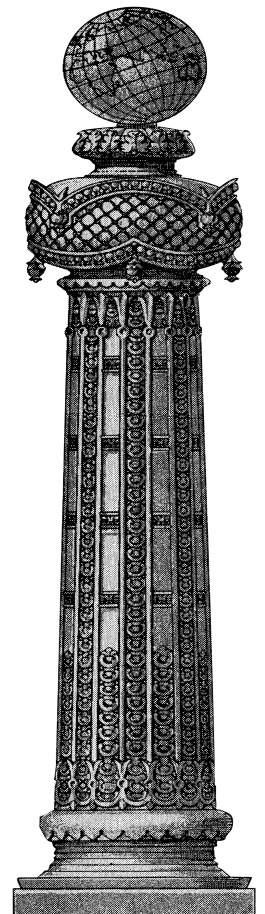
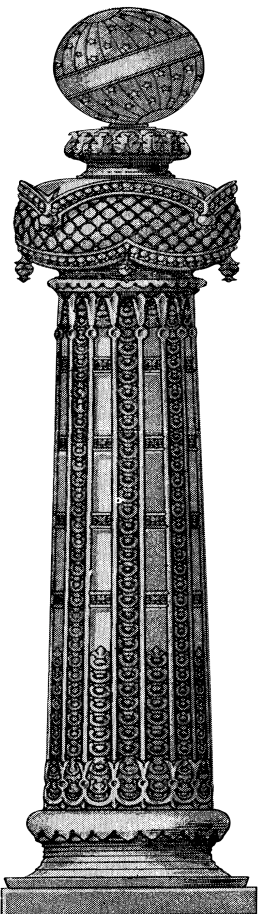
